

Vocabulary Their Way

This year I will be using *Vocabulary Their Way* program in my classroom. This program will provide skill instruction that will cover vocabulary and focus on examining structures of words, grammar and definitions. Students will be thinking more critically about words and work on transferring their skills to reading and writing. *Vocabulary Their Way* will focus on teaching students how to recognize patterns in word meanings and word structures (prefixes, suffixes), grammar (nouns, adjectives, verbs, etc) and also other word studies such as homophones. The simple process of sorting words into categories is the heart of our word study program. When students sort words, they are engaged in the active process of searching, comparing, contrasting, and analyzing. Word sorts help students organize what they know about words and to form generalizations that they can then apply to new words they encounter in their reading and writing.

Each week students will get a list of 8 words and will be tested on Fridays. Throughout the week, we will be completing sorting activities in class to work on reinforcing the vocabulary words and their definitions.

Suggestions for practice:

- Assist your child in doing a word hunt, looking for words in a book they
 have already read that have the same patterns or meanings. Try to find two
 or three for each category.
- Do a writing sort to prepare for the Friday test. As you call out the words in a random order your child should write the defintions or you can do it visa versa.
- Have students write the word in sentences.
- Create crossword puzzles. https://www.puzzle-maker.com/CW/
- Write the words on separate cards and definitions on separate cards and play a matching game.
